Weyapiersenwah, better known as Blue Jacket by Indian and better known to us as the early 1760s, probably in Pennsylvania. His parents were unknown but he had a sister known on an island in the Missouri River before the Missouri Basin, in northwest Ohio in 1801. Last principal War Chief of the Shawnee Tribe was a member of Tecumseh and died about 1838 on the banks of the carriers River in Michigan Territory (at what is now Wapakoneta).

A half French, half Indian daughter of Joseph Duquesne, French Canadian trader and agent of the British Indian Service. M. Baby was born in or near Fort Detroit, after 1750. She survived the Shawnee/Wyandot Trail of Tears and died in northeast Kansas Territory about 1843.

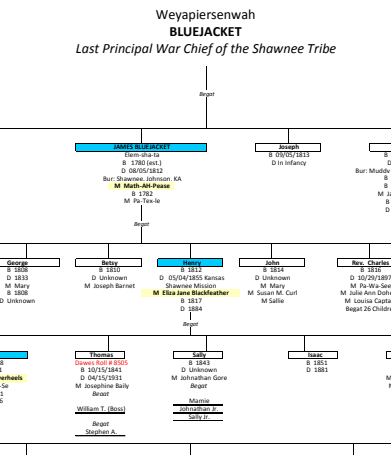
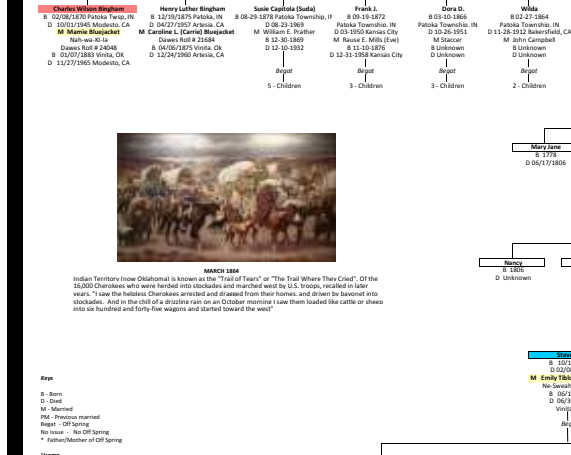
(2) Maria F. Winkler
